## LETTER FROM THE CEO AND THE BOARD CHAIR

Eight years ago, Center on Halsted boldly opened its doors in the Lakeview neighborhood of Chicago. Our mission then, as it remains today, is to advance community and secure the health and well-being of the LGBTQ community. Our successes over the past eight years are testament to the strength of this mission, and the remaining inequity in our community speaks to its sustained relevance in guiding our future work.

Most notably, in the fall of 2014, Center on Halsted opened Town Hall Apartments, Chicagoland's first LGBT-friendly affordable senior housing project, unique in its integration of case management, programming, and services within the building. Shortly after, Center on Halsted relocated its senior services department to the former Town Hall Police Station, attached to the newly constructed apartment complex. Named Center on Addison—An LGBTQ Senior Center, the publically accessible building is home to Senior Services programs and events, including social and meeting spaces, a library, and teaching kitchen.

In the spring of 2015, Center on Halsted celebrated the opening of our LGBTQ Health Research Center, in partnership with IMPACT, The LGBT Health and Development Program at Northwestern University Feinberg School of Medicine, after renovating existing space within our building. This is the nation's first research facility housed in an LGBTQ community center.

With youth homelessness in Chicago disproportionately impacting LGBTQ youth, Center on Halsted made a bold step in approving two housing goals as part of a resolution authorizing a new LGBTQ Youth Housing and Services program. The first, in partnership with another qualified housing provider, is to operate a beta cluster site housing program for youth from the existing Youth Program. The second is for Center on Halsted to have a Youth Intentional Permanent Housing building in operation, housing LGBT homeless youth with wrap-around services targeting education, employment, and health in a supportive community.

Center on Halsted remains committed to advancing the LGBTQ movement through our services, programs, and advocacy work. Thank you for standing with us and joining in community.

## ADVOCACY AND COMMUNITY ENGAGEMENT

Center on Halsted's Advocacy and Community Engagement (ACE) department continued to shape Center on Halsted's involvement in the advocacy sphere, and in FY15, worked with every staff member to strengthen their contribution to these efforts. The ACE department also includes training and legal programs, and shares responsibility for the LGBTQ Violence Resource Line with the Behavioral Health department. In FY15, Center on Halsted's legal program served a total of 834 people: 577 received individualized attention from one of the volunteer attorneys and 257 attended the legal seminar series. Meanwhile, the training program has reached 254 individuals across Chicago's social service agencies. Each receives training in LGBTQ basics, followed by more detailed information on the agency's topic of choice. In FY15, these topics included LGBTQ Aging, Becoming an On-Campus Ally, Working with Transgender Clients, and Mental Health Clinicians as Allies. Through the Violence Resource Line, Center on Halsted served over 80 survivors of domestic, hate, police, and sexual violence.

## COMMUNITY AND CULTURAL PROGRAMS

Center on Halsted provides a diverse array of Community and Cultural Programs, including theatre performances, recreational activities, and ongoing affinity group meetings. To accomplish this, Center on Halsted partners with a diverse array of organizations: Truman Community College to provide GED programming, Joffrey Ballet, Pride Films and Plays, and Unabridged Bookstore among many others. These partnerships (in addition to those with other LGBTQ organizations throughout Chicago) enable Center on Halsted to coordinate a broad mix of events geared towards the entire spectrum of LGBTQ individuals. Specifically, the department works to provide programs for families, women, and transgender individuals. These programs include open play in the Butler-Vanderlinden Child Space, our annual Trans Day of Visibility Celebration, and our bi-annual By Women For Women events. Community and Cultural programming reached over 14,500 patrons in FY15.

## DR. DAVID J. LOCHMAN CYBER CENTER

The Dr. David J. Lochman Cyber Center is a fully equipped and accessible computer lab with 20 computer stations running Windows 7 and Windows 8.1. It provides free online access, job readiness classes, job search programs, and technology training classes on a variety of topics, including Microsoft Office and social media. The Cyber Center also provides services such as printing, scanning, and faxing to patrons. With volunteers, the Cyber Center offers one-on-one assistance to patrons during public access sessions. The Cyber Center also supports other departmental programs with dedicated times for Senior, Youth, and GED programming. This year, the Cyber Center became a Pearson Certified Test Center, providing proctored testing for individuals who are taking GED tests, as well as exams for different technology certifications. In FY15, the Cyber Center served 5,273 patrons.

## SILVER FORK: A CULINARY ARTS PROGRAM

Silver Fork is Center on Halsted's 9-week culinary arts job readiness training program that prepares underemployed and unemployed community members for sustainable employment in the culinary and hospitality industries. Silver Fork offers a comprehensive and sequential core service that includes emphasis on knife skills and speed, foundational studies in the five basic stocks and sauces, industry vocabulary and standards, regional and seasonal cuisines, and expert guest presentations, ranging from in-depth pastry demonstrations to restaurant business basics. In FY15, Silver Fork expanded its job readiness training by an additional 30–35 contact hours, during which the curriculum emphasizes leadership, cultural competency, professional résumé writing and interview skills, and presentations from every Center on Halsted department. The results were telling; in FY15, Silver Fork graduated 60 chefs and enjoyed a marked increase in the number of Silver Fork alumni who accessed services and “paid it forward.” In fact, FY15 saw an unprecedented number of alums who recruited and hired graduates. Chefs from 2012 graduating classes recently hired individuals from the 2014 and 2015 graduating classes.

## BEHAVIORAL HEALTH

Behavioral Health at Center on Halsted has addressed the psychosocial needs of Chicago's LGBTQ community for over 25 years by offering individual, couples, group, and family counseling. Our skilled team of behavioral health professionals includes licensed staff psychologists, licensed staff social workers, graduate students, and contractual and volunteer therapists. Our team offers affirming and strengths-based services in a safe and supportive environment.

We provide the following modalities of therapy: individual, relationship, family, and group. This year, Behavioral Health served 358 clients, with 93% of survey respondents reporting a benefit from therapy and 75% showing improvement in symptoms and functioning through scientifically-validated measurement methods.

Through the Anti-violence Project, the Behavioral Health Department has continued its efforts to raise the level of awareness regarding domestic violence, sexual assault, and hate and other violent crimes within the LGBTQ community. The Anti-Violence Project plans to be extremely active in domestic violence service-provider networks, assuring that issues unique to LGBTQ clients are addressed by mainstream providers.

Finally, the Behavioral Health Department provides training through its Sexual Orientation and Gender Institute (SOGI). This institute was established to provide high-level training on a variety of LGBTQ clinical topics for clinicians. This year, SOGI co-sponsored three professional education presentations in collaboration with Howard Brown Health Center and Lake Shore Hospital. Also, the organization hosted the second annual LGBTQ Health and Wellness Conference with IMPACT, the LGBT Health and Development Program at Northwestern University. This conference is designed to bring together scientists, public health professionals, social workers, psychologists and counselors in an interdisciplinary setting.

The team continued to provide excellent clinical training to students seeking Masters and Doctoral degrees in social work, counseling, and psychology. Our training program offers diverse opportunities to graduate students looking to expand their professional experiences while helping to build and strengthen the LGBTQ community. The training program offers trainees individual and group supervision, didactic workshops, and field experience.



## SENIOR SERVICES

Center on Halsted provides comprehensive and holistic programming to over 500 seniors each year. Through the City of Chicago's Golden Diners Program, the organization offers lunch to seniors four times per week. Additionally, Senior Services offers a wide array of classes, groups, outings, and workshops including fitness classes, discussion groups, and educational seminars.

The Senior Services program provides information and referral resources to our seniors and can help connect them to benefits and programs. Patrons who are in need of employment assistance are eligible to benefit from two employment programs that are offered through the program: SAGEWorks and the Senior Community Service Employment Program (SCSEP). A recent survey of Senior Services program participants indicated that 85% reported reduced isolation through their participation in program and 93% reported increased access to sources of support and service through referrals received.

For seniors who are unable to attend programming at Center on Halsted, the Senior Services program offers a Friendly Visitor Program, where volunteers visit isolated or lonely LGBTQ older adults on a weekly basis in their home. Through the Homesharing Program, Senior Services help facilitate matches between renters and those looking to rent out a room. The Homesharing Provider, generally a LGBTQ older adult, benefits from companionship, extra income, and help around the house through their participation in the Homesharing Program. The Homesharing Program is the first and only LGBTQ-specific Homesharing Program in the nation.

Last fall, in partnership with Heartland Alliance, Center on Halsted opened Town Hall apartments, Chicagoland's first LGBTQ-Friendly Senior Housing project. Heartland Alliance is the property manager for the project and Center on Halsted provides the programs and services to the residents. Subsequent to the opening of Town Hall Apartments, Center on Halsted relocated its Senior programming to the former Town Hall Police Station, attached to the newly constructed apartment complex. Named Center on Addison—An LGBTQ Senior Center, the publically-accessible building is home to Senior Service programs and events, including a teaching kitchen, a library, and meeting and social space.

## HIV/AIDS & STD SERVICES

Center on Halsted's Department of HIV/AIDS & STD Services is comprised of three distinct programs: State of Illinois AIDS/HIV & STD Hotline, HIV Testing & Prevention, and HIV Prevention Support Services. Although each program is distinct in activities and services offered, the interventions they provide are highly-interdependent and interwoven throughout our programmatic and service initiatives. The Department of HIV/AIDS & STD Services helps develop and synchronize HIV work throughout Center on Halsted that occurs in non-HIV-specific departments through the stewardship of an HIV thread that requires each department to prioritize HIV prevention and engagement in HIV medical care as they serve their clients. These services are supported through funding from city, state and federal grants along with other funding sources.

**State of Illinois AIDS/HIV & STD Hotline:** For 21 years, Center on Halsted has operated the Hotline, a free and anonymous service operating daily from 8:00 a.m. to 10:00 p.m. The English/Spanish-speaking Hotline staff offers individualized risk assessments, comprehensive referrals, linkage to HIV medical care and Pre-Exposure Prophylaxis (PrEP), and the latest information about HIV/AIDS and STDs to callers in the State of Illinois, throughout the United States, and outside of the country. With a database of over 2,800 statewide referral services at more than 900 service sites, Health Educators provide callers with a wealth of information regarding local health, social, and support services. Staff on the Hotline undergo comprehensive and ongoing training. In FY15, Hotline staff received 8,300 calls. Callers to the Hotline also received more than 1,000 statewide referrals to HIV/STD related services in FY15.

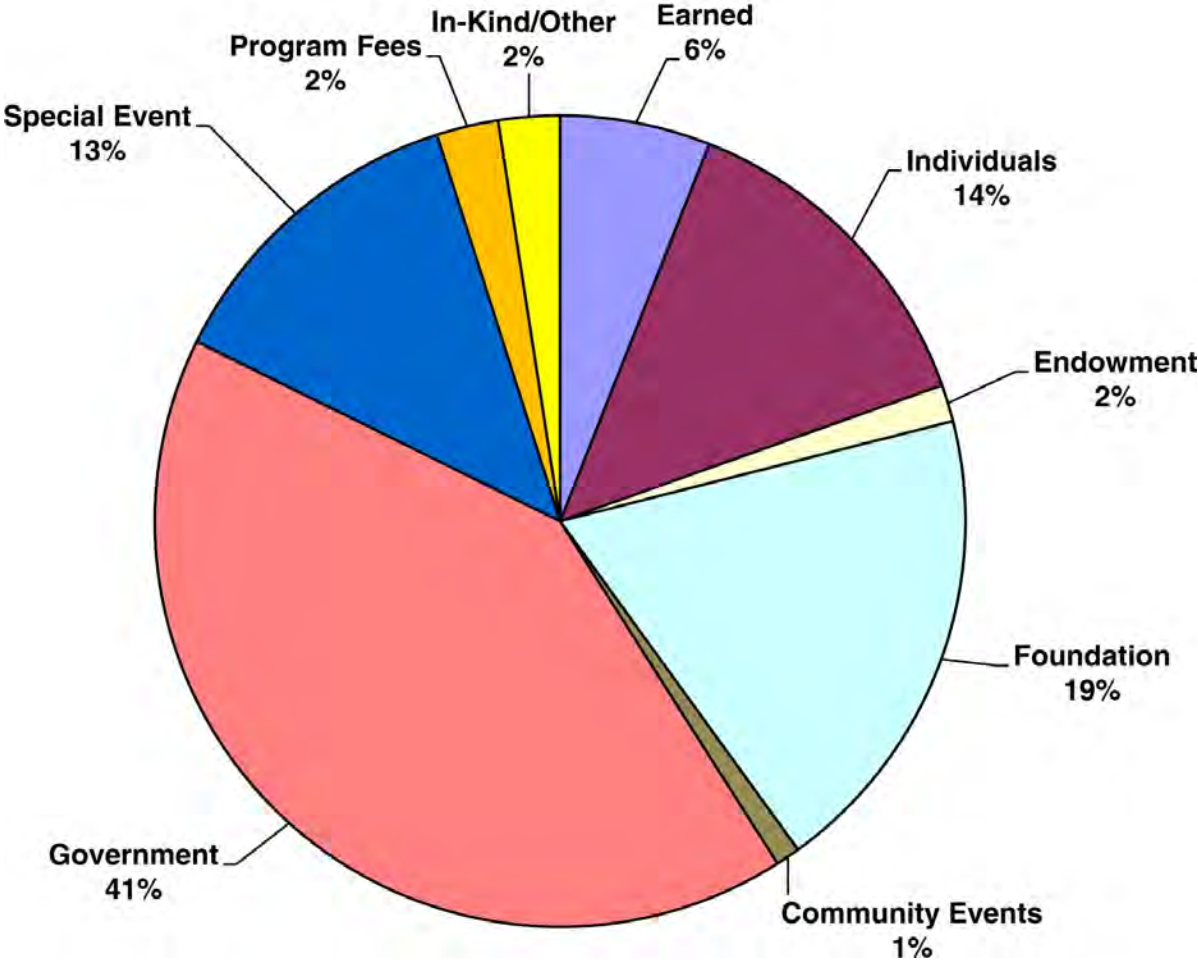
**HIV Support Services:** Center on Halsted provides individuals who are at-risk or who have tested positive for HIV with additional services offered within our program. Trained Health Educators who are knowledgeable about HIV and service referrals offer clients up to eight free counseling/supportive case management sessions, and ensure an HIV+ client's connection to primary medical care. In FY15, over 350 HIV+, high-risk HIV-negative, and potentially high-risk negative clients were provided with individual, couples, or group counseling services through the Department of HIV/AIDS & STD Services and Behavioral Health Services.

**HIV Testing & Prevention:** Center on Halsted launched its highly-successful HIV Testing & Prevention Program in May 2008. In FY15 year we tested 3,889 individuals. The Testing & Prevention Program provides free, rapid, and confidential HIV testing to clients on an appointment or walk-in basis. Our testing includes enhanced individual risk-assessment, prevention planning, and linkage to care. Clients who test positive for HIV, or who need additional support services, are linked to external partners or to internal services such as Behavioral Health, the Youth Program, Senior Services, or the Legal Program. In FY15, Center on Halsted's Linkage to Care Program connected 84 HIV+ individuals to primary HIV medical specialists. An average of 23 contacts per client was needed to actively engage HIV+ clients into medical care. Our highly-successful testing initiatives include Walk-in Wednesdays (walk-in HIV testing from 4:00–8:00 p.m.), Walk-in Saturdays (11:00 a.m. –3:00 p.m.), *Centro de tu Noche/Center of your Night* (walk-in HIV testing from 10:30 p.m. –2:00 a.m. on Thursdays), and site-based and medical mobile unit outreach testing throughout the city of Chicago and suburbs.

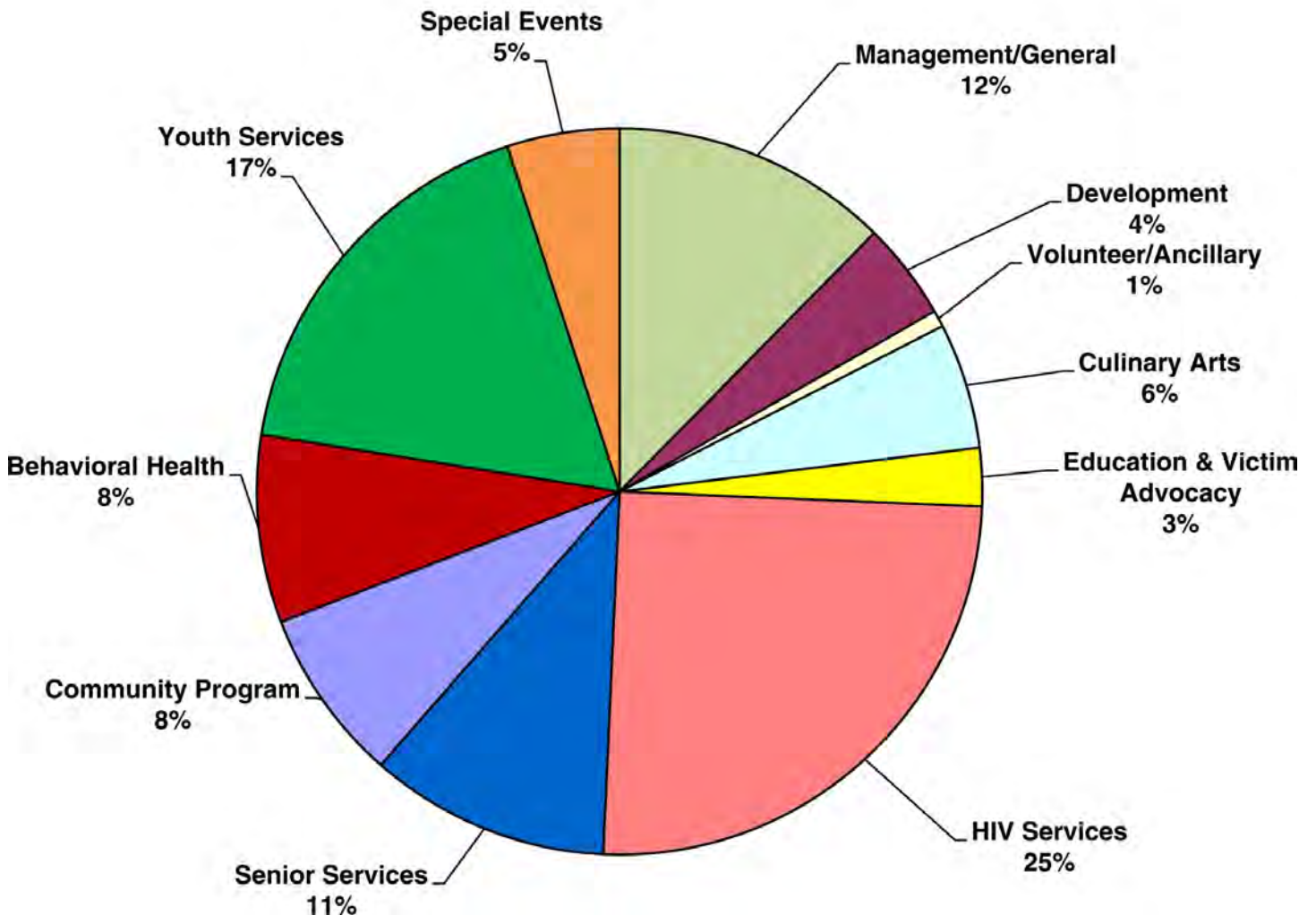
## YOUTH PROGRAM

The Youth Program provides young people with the resources, skills, and tools needed to improve emotional resiliency, lifelong achievement rates, and become productive adults. The Youth Program offers daily after-school programming employing the theme Expect More. Expect More encourages youth to aim high in both their goals and their behaviors. This model highlights and compliments the understanding that youth hold many of the keys to their own positive development, and the program views youth as assets to the LGBTQ community in Chicagoland and beyond. Expect More is implemented through weekly workshops focused on six tracks, including sexual health and identity, critical thinking and education, leadership and activism, recreation and sports, and vocational and professional development. In addition to Expect More programming, the Youth Program offers adult ally support, generally focused around the immediate needs most frequently identified by many of our youth including housing, employment, education, and health. The Youth Program also offers individual and group counselling support to help youth who are struggling with a variety of behavioral health needs. Through partnerships with Heartland Health Outreach, Chicago Coalition for the Homeless, and numerous social service agencies working with LGBTQ youth, we are providing our participants with the supports they need to not only survive, but thrive. Last year, the Youth Program provided services to close to 345 young people ages 13–24.
